- Heavy pen pressure tells anger and tension, moderately heavy tells commitment. Soft pressure means empathetic and sensitive and lack vitality.
- If the dot on 'i' (it is applicable even for the lowercase letter 'j') is high, it tells active imagination, closely doted 'i' means organized and detail oriented mind, if the dot is to the left they are procrastinators and

if 'i' is dotted with a circle then they are playful and childlike qualities.

- Legible sign tells that a person is confident and comfortable, illegible sign tells that a person is private and is hard for others to read or understand
- Left slant tells that a person is introvert and right slant tell that a person is an extravert
- If 't' is capped with long cross , it is determined that a person is enthusiastic and have stubborn tendencies . If 't' is capped with short cross , it means lazy . Cross for lowercase 't' is high means the person aims high and if the cross is low, it means that the person do not have much goals and is not confident about his/her-self.
- If the loop in letter 'l' (it is even applicable for other lowercase letters like 'b', 'h'), is wide, it means that the person is relaxed and spontaneous. If the loop in letter 'l' is narrow, it means that the person is restricting his/her-self
- If the hook of lowercase letter 'y' (it is even applicable for lowercase letters like 'g' 'j') is broad, it means the person need large circle of people around. If the hook is slender, it means that the person is more selective to whom he/she is close with. If the hook is short, it means that the person is homebody.
